# Honeycomb Block Swap <br> From Quilt Magazine <br> Linda Johnson 

Fabrics: Please use prewashed quality fabrics. Please exclude 30" prints, novelty, babies, and Christmas.

Finished block size: $3^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ A small crib size quilt would take 60 blocks, probably twice that for a lap.

Each block takes two fabrics with contrast between the two fabrics. (For Ex. Light w dark corners, dark w light or medium corners). Pre wash and iron all fabrics. Please do not make more than 6-8 blocks from one fabric so we might have variety.

Cutting: Cut $3 \frac{1}{2}^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. For the corners cut 4-2" squares of same fabric for each of the rectangles. Sew the four corners on the rectangles with diagonal seams trim and press. Looks like a snow ball block.

Place blocks in a zip lock bag with you name and \# of blocks included in your bag on the outside of the bag.
