
Mystery Quilt Clue 2:


From the 6 yards of solid appearing fabric, cut 14 strips 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches X 42 inches. Sub-cut these strips into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ X 6 $\frac{1}{2}$. Place half of these 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ into a ziplock for use at a later time.

To make Block A:


1. Sew a 2 ½ X 2 ½ inch print square to the end of a 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch Solid appearing fabric. Press seam allowance toward the print square. It takes 4 of these to make one block. Using 28 of the Nine Patches made in Clue one, sew one rectangle unit to the nine patch unit, stopping about 1 inch from the end of the nine - patch unit. Press seam allowance toward the rectangle. It is important that you go in the same direction each time while attaching this unit to the nine patches. See the illustration.



2. Sew the second and third units to the nine patch unit as shown, working in a counter-clockwise direction around the nine-patch unit.



3. Sew the final rectangle unit to nine patch and press. Sew the small open section of the nine patch seam closed to complete the block.



4. Repeat steps to make a total of 28 blocks. Place finished blocks in a ziplock and mark as BLOCK A.
